
Much of these past few months have been spent on holidays and translating, so I'd like to share some of the books I've read and reviewed while I take think breaks.



Stork is about a teen-aged girl who moves to Minnesota from Los Angeles. It begins as the typical uprooted teen in a ho-hum new location in a newly broken home. She is an independent young woman and not afraid to confront the different mindset of her new home. What she is not prepared for are some unexplained events that begin to happen to her. ### TRANSLATION~COMMUNICATION

I mentioned that I have been doing a lot of translating lately. I've had some challenges. which I love! I love communicating with the authors and others that help with the book. I love being given license to translate puns to a way I see appropriate in Spanish. Languages do not translate word for word, anyway, Given that and the fact that we're actually using different words, you can imagine the fun I can have seeking a similar word play in Spanish or a similar expression, like "it's raining cats and dogs", which of course is not used in Spanish. I seek rhymes and alien vocabulary, all which I prefer to discuss with the author, to make sure I maintain the flow and the intended meaning of the original work.

After all, a translator is merely trying to communicate the same story in another language in the same style and the same meaning. If you are bilingual and read one book, then read the other, you want to feel like you've read the same book.
